An Achieving the Dream (AtD) Leader College, Montgomery is positioned at the vanguard of national efforts to increase completion, improve learning outcomes, and remove barriers to access for 19,566 credit students and 3,434 non-credit students. The College is also recognized regionally and nationally for its work with military veterans, sustainability leadership, and opportunities for community service and service learning.



Respected professionals in their fields, Montgomery's faculty continually strive to develop and refine curricula that prepare students for a competitive and evolving marketplace.

In April 2016, the College opened the Sustainability and Innovation Hub at West Campus in Pottstown, where students, faculty and the community can collaborate on environmental projects, as well as conduct research in science, technology, engineering and math-related (STEM) fields. The Hub includes a hydroponics and aquaponics laboratory, a maker space for 3D printing, robotics and engineering, and an open area for classroom or meeting space. The Hub also offers professional development programs, such as the new Software Developer Academy.



The College's Engineering and Biotechnology programs are on the cutting edge of STEM innovation. Montgomery became the first community college in the Commonwealth to join the Pennsylvania Space Grant Consortium under a three-year project funded in part by NASA and developed in coordination with Temple University. The

College also leads the critical work of the Northeast Biomanufacturing Center Collaborative (NBC2), funded in part by the National Science Foundation, in developing a skilled workforce in biomanufacturing.
