The Partnership College

Recently named one of the Top 150 community colleges in America by The Aspen Institute, Community College of Beaver County (CCBC) partners with K-12 educators, other institutions of higher education, businesses and industries, and community organizations in order to provide students, Beaver County and the surrounding region with a wide array of opportunities that address regional, economic development, workforce and quality-of-life needs. By doing so, CCBC supports its commitment to lead, educate, innovate, and inspire the region and its people.



An *Achieving the Dream* Leader College, CCBC is located in Monaca, PA, minutes northwest of Pittsburgh, and encompasses 11 buildings on its 113-acre main campus. The Aviation Sciences Center, located at the Beaver County Airport, is home to a nationally recognized Air Traffic Control program.

In the Spotlight: High School Academies

CCBC is developing a nationally distinctive high school academies program that seeks to provide hands-on learning and to create career vision and inspiration for students in grades 10-12. The academies provide students with the opportunity to earn half or more of the required associate degree credits before high school graduation, completing more than a year of college while still in high school. The first CCBC Academy, the Aviation Academy, enrolled its first class in January 2015. High school students from participating school districts experience the four nationally distinctive CCBC aviation educational pathways: professional pilot, air traffic control, aerospace management, and unmanned aerial vehicles.



The CCBC Health Academy for high school students interested in careers in nursing, practical nursing, and radiologic technology began in fall 2016. The STEM Academy with career tracks in process technology and engineering will begin in fall 2017.
