HACC, Central Pennsylvania's Community College, was established in 1964, and is the largest and oldest of Pennsylvania's 14 community colleges. HACC is the sole institution of its kind serving the Central Pennsylvania region.

Students attend HACC to transfer credits towards bachelor's degree programs at four-year colleges or universities; take classes while attending high school; participate in weekend workshops; complete associate degree programs online or in the classroom; obtain customized hands-on, affordable training; continue education beyond a degree; learn English as a Second Language (ESL); or prepare for a GED.

HACC was one of the first six educational institutions to provide full iTunes U courses along with Duke University, Stanford University, Yale University, MIT and Open University.

HACC has the second largest active military and veteran population among public colleges and universities in Pennsylvania, and trains a significant number of police, firefighters, paramedics, nurses, dental hygienists and other service providers who work in our 10-county region.
