Focus on: Lehigh Carbon Community College

The college has established transfer or course equivalency agreements with 50 colleges and universities across the state. LCCC offers two-year associate degrees, certificate and specialized diploma programs, and workforce training for students studying full time, part time or online.



The college's aviation program was approved by the Federal Aviation Administration as a Part 141 Flight School, in addition to its existing status as a ground school in February 2016. The college now provides not only the ground instruction required to earn various pilot ratings, but also is able to provide the flight training component. Also, in the summer 2016, the college signed an agreement with ExpressJet Airlines offering aviation students at the college a potential career progression with the airline. Through this pilot pathway agreement, a student who completes the professional pilot program at LCCC (with flight training accomplished in-house) will receive a guaranteed early interview at ExpressJet. The program is designed to provide opportunities for future employment for graduates of the LCCC program, and to build a hiring pool of pilots for the airline.

In credit and noncredit programs, LCCC plays an integral role in the region's workforce development. Assisted by the \$10 million TAACCCT grant, noncredit offerings help fill a demand for skilled production and technical workers in programs such as CDL, advanced manufacturing, public safety and health care.



More than 2,000 high school students are currently taking credit courses at LCCC as part of the dual enrollment program, which allows them to earn college credits while still in high school. In addition, LCCC has been named to the Military Friendly Schools® list, with veterans' lounges on the Schnecksville and Tamaqua campuses that provide additional resources to students.

SHINE (Schools and Homes in Education), a nationally recognized afterschool program administered by LCCC, serves students in five rural, economically depressed school districts in Carbon and Schuylkill counties, covering 700-plus square miles. Its mission is to link schools and homes in education to build a strong social and academic foundation.
