Focus on: Luzerne County Community College

Luzerne County Community College (LCCC) is a public two-year college serving the residents of Luzerne County and the surrounding area throughout northeastern Pennsylvania. The College's mission is to provide excellence in education, foster student success in achievement of goals, and positively impact Luzerne County and northeastern PA.

The College offers 82 occupational programs (including degree, certificate and diploma programs) and 24 liberal arts/transfer programs that are accessible, affordable, and flexible in delivery. LCCC has the region's largest credit enrollment and also offers non-credit career training programs and customized workforce development programming. Credits earned at LCCC are transferable to other accredited colleges and universities nationwide.



The College's Public Safety Training Institute opened in 2008 on 32 acres of land, includes an administrative building and a burn building/training tower to help train first responders. The Institute also includes a road course, skid pad, maneuver pad, helipad, off-road course, confined space training prop, and vehicle extrication pad. The Public Safety Training Institute also houses the College's Act 235 and CDL training programs.

The Joseph A. Paglianite Culinary Institute opened in 2010. The 22,000 square foot state-of-the art facility includes a teaching kitchen, line kitchen, pastry kitchen, chocolate room, four smart classrooms, faculty offices, and the Kowalski Media Center, which is an 80-seat classroom/theater with audio-visual capabilities.



The Francis S. and Mary Gill Carrozza, R.N. Health Sciences Center opened in 2011. The 51,000 square foot facility houses the College's Dental Clinic with 24 chairs and x-ray room, surgical technology and nursing simulation labs, blood gas test room, lung function lab, computer labs, ten smart classrooms, and 30 faculty offices.

The College's newest site, the Scranton Center, at The Marketplace at Steamtown opened in fall 2016. A site in the city of Pittston is scheduled to open in fall 2018.
